Year 2-3 News

In maths this week we are starting to study Measurement. The year three students have been measuring how many small (100ml) containers of water they can fit in containers of various shapes and sizes. Year two have done some experiments with a variety of small objects, like unifix cubes, to see how many they could fit inside a jug. We decided that using unifix cubes probably isn't the most accurate way to measure volume because there are too many gaps between cubes!

Thank you to the parents who are putting a mark next to concepts their child is struggling with in their maths homework! It creates great discussions in class and really helps to pinpoint areas others may be confused with also. In regards to the find-a-words in the homework, they are just there for a bit of fun and are not marked. Don't worry if they aren't completed!
